- That the leaders meet regularly with Calin every Monday for prayer and fellowship as well as planning.

- Pray for all the presentations currently taking place in several churches will encourage volunteers to apply for short-term mission at holiday clubs and camps during July and August.
- Pray that the brochure being re-designed to advertise our work will attract new and fresh interest.
- For the group studying John's Gospel over a cycle of 6 weeks will draw in many fresh faces in the village of Leona
- That Calin will feel well supported both financially and materially with much needed craft materials.
- For more young Romanian people to find in their heart the desire to help in His work.
- Pray that enough Romanian leaders will be recruited to staff the ambitious plans for the summer programme.
- Pray that the new training materials that Calin has received will bring fruit and harvest to future youth leaders of tomorrow.

It just remains for me to hope that you are enjoying reading these regular prayer letters and that you will inform other interested parties of the wonderful work taking place in Romania.
